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Introduction

The Hardy Center is an organization that works tirelessly to improve the literacy, leadership, and life skills of the children that come to the center and participate in our programs. The school-based instruction we offer along with a variety of other programs guarantee success inside, and outside, of the classroom.

The Hardy Center is located in the North Linden area in Columbus, and nearly all of the children who participate in the program are residents of the area. Many of the students that come into the center do not have access to the same educational resources and assistance that students of the same age have in surrounding suburban areas of Columbus.

During the school year, The Hardy Center offers an after-school program for children in grades K-8. Whether they need help with homework, to study for an upcoming test, or a nutritious meal, the Hardy Center is there to provide it all. The current educational system assumes that all students have parents waiting at home to help their student with their schoolwork - we have found that in our neighborhood, this is often not the case. Many parents, whether they themselves have not completed their education or they are working until 6 pm, are unable to take on this complicated and necessary role of after-school teacher/tutor. That's where The Hardy Center comes in.

With the permission of the parent, The Hardy Center and its staff helps children not only complete their homework, but understand it as well. The center is staffed with a dynamic mix of retired teachers, education students, and Linden community members and volunteers. The center houses a comprehensive computer lab, ensuring access to technology and knowledge that will help them to excel and succeed that they may not be able to access at school or home. The center offers a nutritious meal to each student as well, to make sure that a healthy mind has the healthy body to sustain it. On top of all of this, The Hardy Center offers a whole range of dynamic and specialized extracurricular activities, like gardening, chess club, and unicycling.

Participation in these programs helps to improve both weekly and standardized test scores, as well as everyday study habits and discipline.


Measuring Our Progress
